This is a group effort. A theatrical production requires so much effort from so many different people; and ultimately, all that effort needs to work in concert in order for it to be successful. Building this production together has allowed us to meet new people, rejoice in help from diverse sources in and outside the West Noble Community, and keep our chins up despite challenges due to weather. It has been such a pleasure to share this particular show with so many hard-working students and colleagues. You and your families have proven that the whole is greater than the sum of its parts. Thank you for making this particular group effort so rewarding!
