AIDS is the FIFTH LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH in the United States for people ages 25 to 44

Worldwide approximately **11 in 1000 adults** aged 15 to 49 is **HIV-infected**

INDIANA Statistics

In Lake County, Indiana (the Gary area) 463 deaths have occurred as a result of AIDS.

194 AIDS deaths have occurred in **Allen County**, Indiana (**Fort Wayne** area).

The **South Bend** area (**St. Joe County**) has been the place of **187 AIDS** deaths.

133 AIDS deaths have occurred in **Vanderburg County**, Indiana (**Evansville** area).

3,835 deaths from **AIDS** have occurred in **Indiana** since 1981 - - more than **half** of those **(1,436)** were in the **Indianapolis** area.

A chain of 288 one-to-one sexual relationships was found at a high school in the Midwest, meaning the teenager at the end of the chain may have had direct sexual contact with one person, but indirect contact with 286 others.
